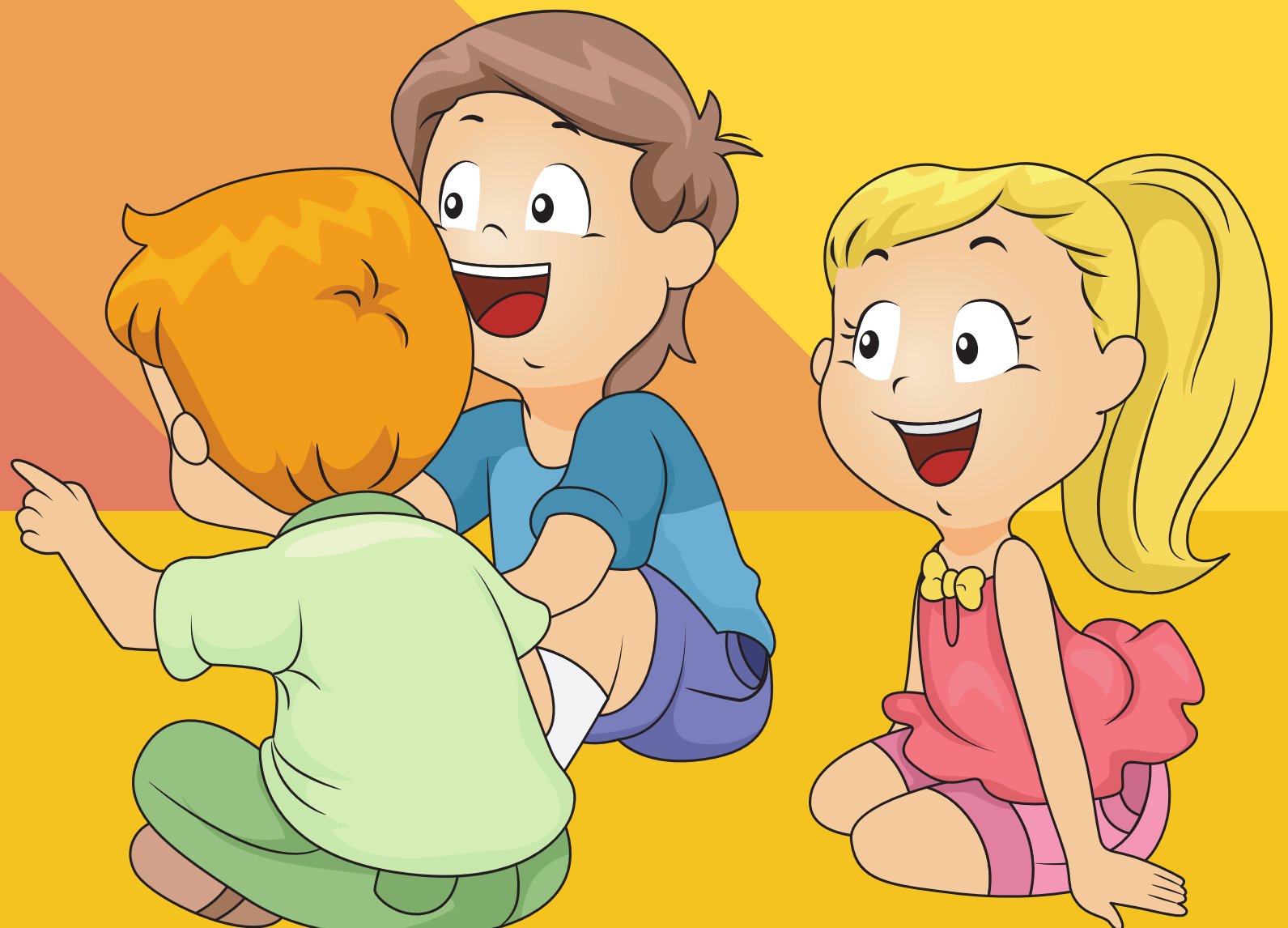
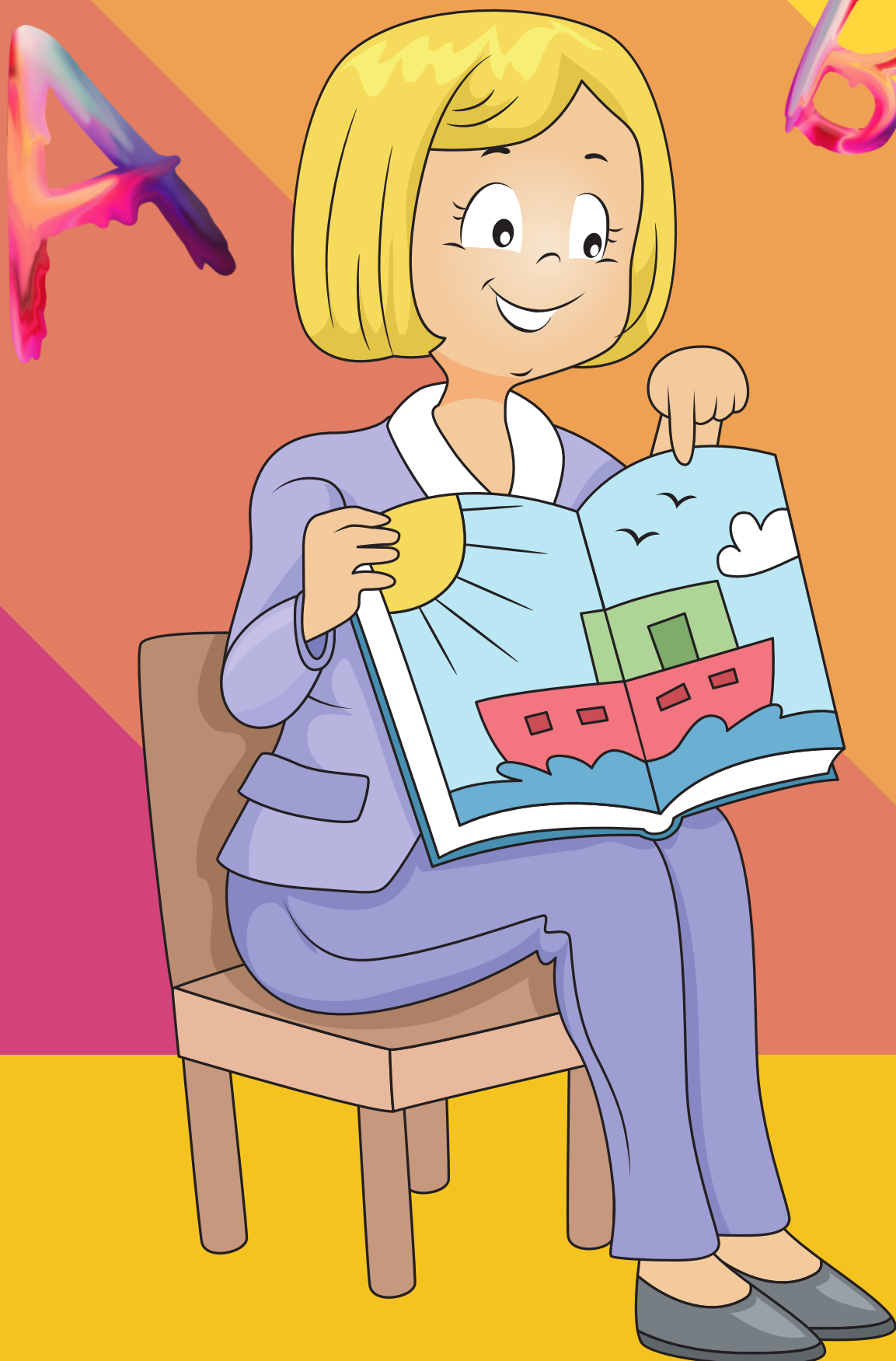

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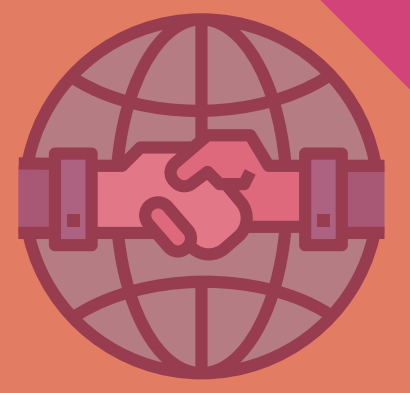

THE AUDACITY OF HOPE

In this best-selling book, Obama discusses the importance of empathy and inclusiveness in politics, his hopes for a different America with different policies, and how the ideals of its democracy can be renewed. A public servant and a lawyer, a professor and a father, Obama has written a book of transforming power that will inspire people worldwide. This book was published in 2006, just three years before Obama became the 44th United States of America. He wrote this book to ensure a steady income for his family while continuing with his political career. Obama conveys his thoughts about the damaged politics of the US and offers his ideas and methods to fix the damaged system that supports negative campaigns, a system that used to be fair but had gone corrupt over the years. This book is an extended meditation on the three main themes of that speech.

First, he argues that the partisan bitterness that has characterized American politics since the mid-1990s is unnecessary and self-indulgent. By fixating on a narrow set of "wedge issues" that resonate with their respective activist bases, leaders in both the Republican and Democratic parties have alienated millions of ordinary Americans from politics at the very moment when decisive political decisions are most needed. Second, to re-earn their legitimacy, he believes politicians need to abandon the "culture war" rhetoric and focus on the modest, everyday aspirations and concerns of the moderate majority: for decent jobs, affordable healthcare when they need it, and for a good education for their children. Third, this will require, he argues, not just a different set of issues but a different way of talking about them. Time and again, Obama returns to the need for "a new kind of politics, one that can excavate and build upon those shared understandings that pull us together as Americans." Once and for all, it also lays clear what Obama's views are on several controversial subjects, including the Iraq war, abortion, and, of course, equal rights for minorities. None of it is especially ground-breaking, especially now after he's been in office for so long, but it's still a great way to get a glimpse inside the mind of the most powerful man on earth. "The Audacity of Hope" offers readers a chance to get into the mind of America's most charismatic politicians and also paints the landscape of the post-Bush Era. Like Bill Clinton, Obama has the knack of weaving things together, the personal and the conceptual. Distilled into a short paragraph, Obama's views are essential that we should all treat each other with the respect that we all deserve, that we should aim to compromise if necessary to develop a better future and that at the end of the day, the audacity of hope and the power of individual people coming together under a common cause will be enough to make the world a better place. Let's hope he's right – I certainly agree with him, and it's fascinating to see how he maintained his position as best as he could on the subjects he mentions, making this book a must read.

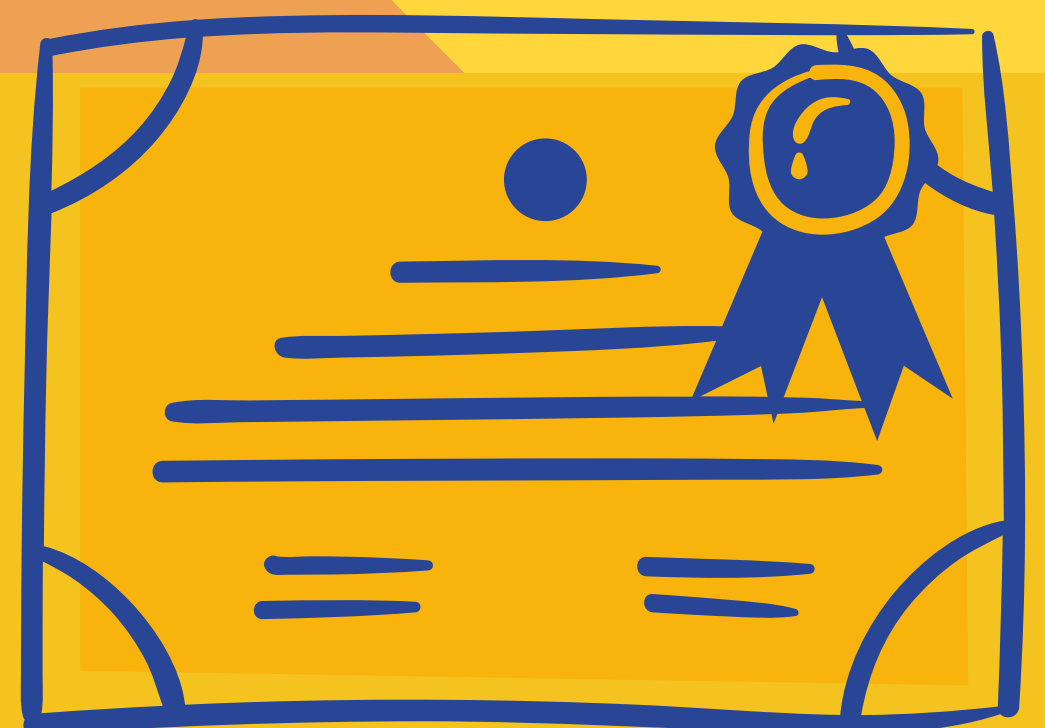

Had i really succeeded at anything else, I might never have found the determination to succeed in the one area where I truly belonged. I was set free, because my greatest fear had been realized, and I was still alive. and still had a daughter whom I adored, and I had an old typewriter, and a big idea. And so rock bottom became a solid foundation on which I Rebuilt my life."

Make new mistakes. Make glorious, amazing mistakes. Make mistakes nobody's ever made before because our greatest glory is not in never failing, but in rising everytime we fall.

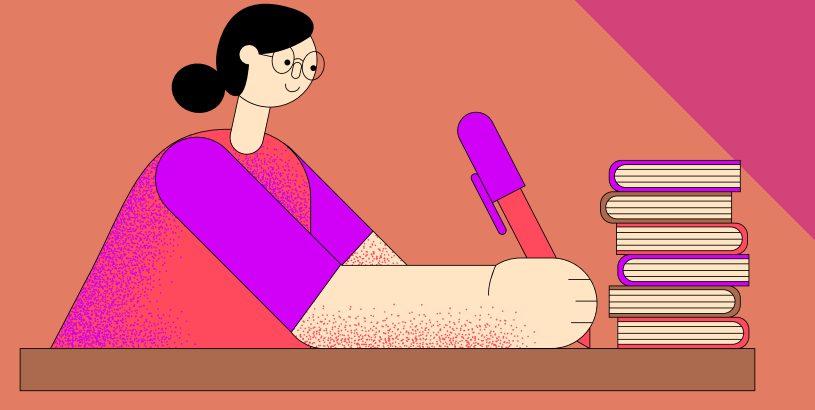

सृजनात्मक लेखन



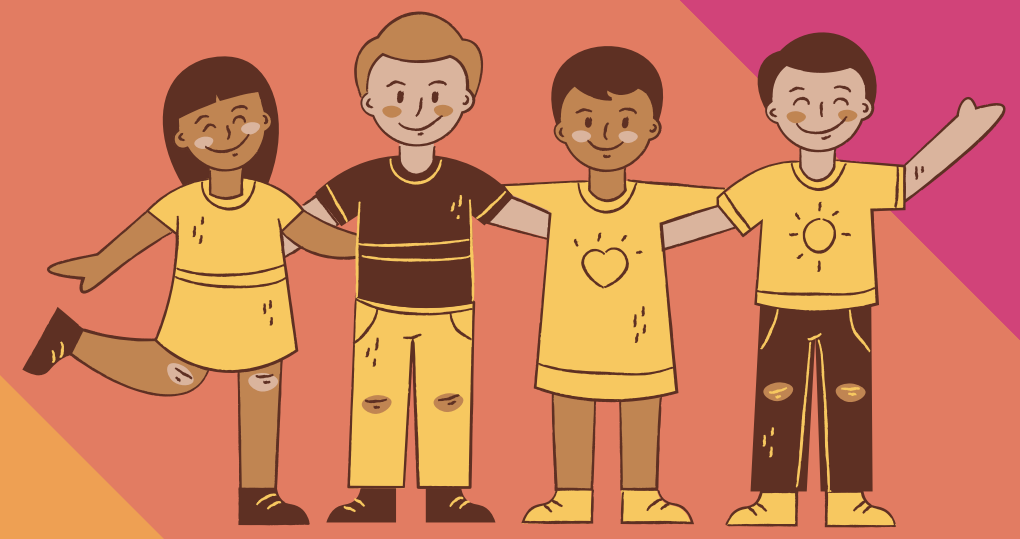

THROUGH THE WORMHOLE

THE FUTURE OF ENERGY GENERATION

As power consumption increases every day just like the population, we need to cover its gap with innovative ideas which will form the future of our society, Solar carports which are car parking decks with equipped solar panels on the roof. The space that is taken up by the carport can be used to generate the sun's energy/solar energy. So, no additional land space is needed for the making of the resourceful use of space. While our car is parked and safe, the carport doubles up as an energy provider.

A solar carport is like a ground-mounted solar panel, but the structure is intentionally built tall enough to house cars parked underneath. In most of the solar parking lots, electric car charging stations are also set up so that the electric vehicles could be recharged with solar power while parked.

The effects of solar carports are huge. The level of use of conventional sources of energy is increasing day by day such as petrol, diesel use for vehicles and various other uses but with the help of solar carports, many things could be done at one place such as parking space for cars will be increased, they will promote the use of electric cars thus less pollution and the biggest advantage is that solar energy which is very expensive to set up can be used at this place to conserve energy because once set up, it will be a huge long-term benefit as fewer purchases to be done regarding energies. Using solar energy will slowly and gradually make a difference in the housing bills for i.e. As we are using solar energy, there will be a huge difference in your bills too.

With solar energy, we only pay for the costs of the panels and installation. From there, the sun does all the work, and it isn't anything that we need to pay for. Using solar energy means we will save on household energy bills since we will rely less on electricity and someday it may be possible that we may even not have any energy bills at all.

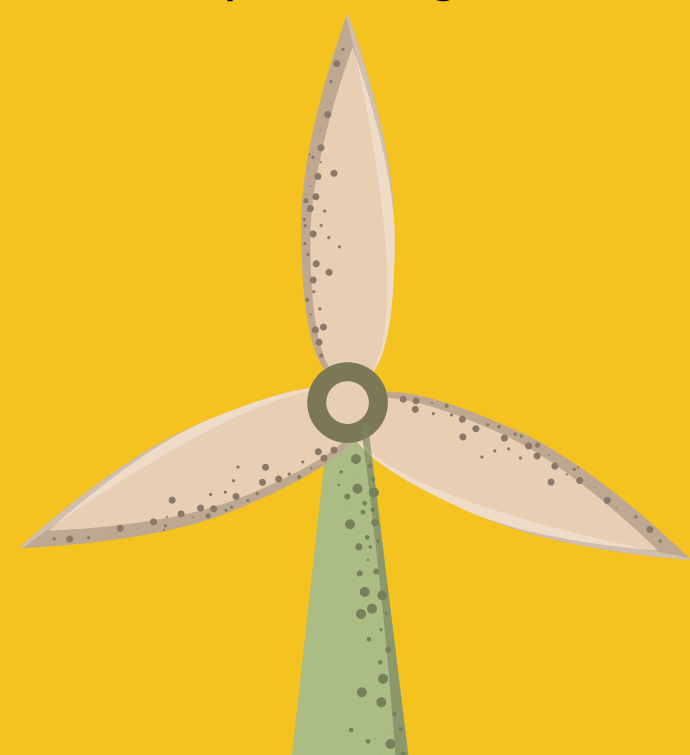
Secondly, apart from housing bills, increment of pollution is also a major concern i.e., global warming and huge costs have been incurred to do improve the condition but then also the condition has not improved much. One of the most important benefits of using these solar carports is that will help in preventing the deterioration of the environment thus money is also being saved.

It shows a real commitment to using sustainable resources by using solar power and fossil fuels being conserved. CO₂ emissions are greatly reduced thus pollution levels being decreased and helps for the betterment of the environment. Solar carports play a major role in shading cars and lowering operating and maintenance expenses in areas that see high accumulations of snow in the winter.

Tata Motors and Tata Power inaugurated India's solar carport as its facility in Chikhali, Pune. The initiative is taken in line with Tata's Group philosophy to promote green manufacturing. The 6.2 MW solar carport deployed by Tata will generate 86.4 lakh kWh of electricity per year and is estimated to reduce 7,000 tons of carbon emissions annually. The carport almost spans over 30000 square meters and will generate green power along with providing covered parking for finished cars in the plant.

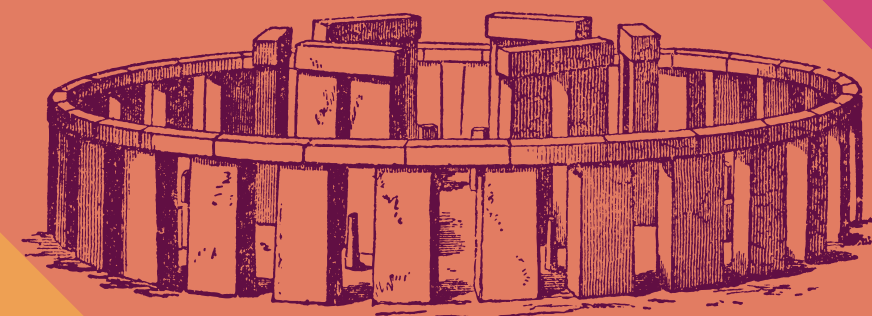
Solar carports can create a very bright future for India and can also help the betterment of the Indian economy. The use of electric vehicles use is and will soon be increasing several folds in India, and solar carports will be promoting them at a very large scale thus pollution and energy levels used to be less thus resources being saved. While installing EV chargers can require a very long timeframe, and as the use of electric vehicles continues to become more increasing all around the country, solar carports can often provide property owners with a higher rate of return due to their energy production capabilities. Installing chargers while erecting a carport can help subsidize the cost of the EV charger installed while providing a payback for the entire solution.

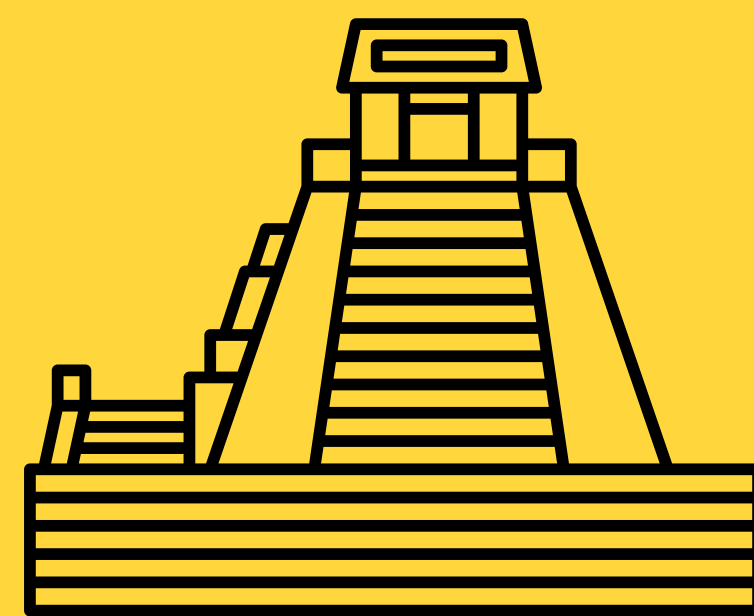

But how many younger generation Jammunities are sensitive to the true value of our heritage?

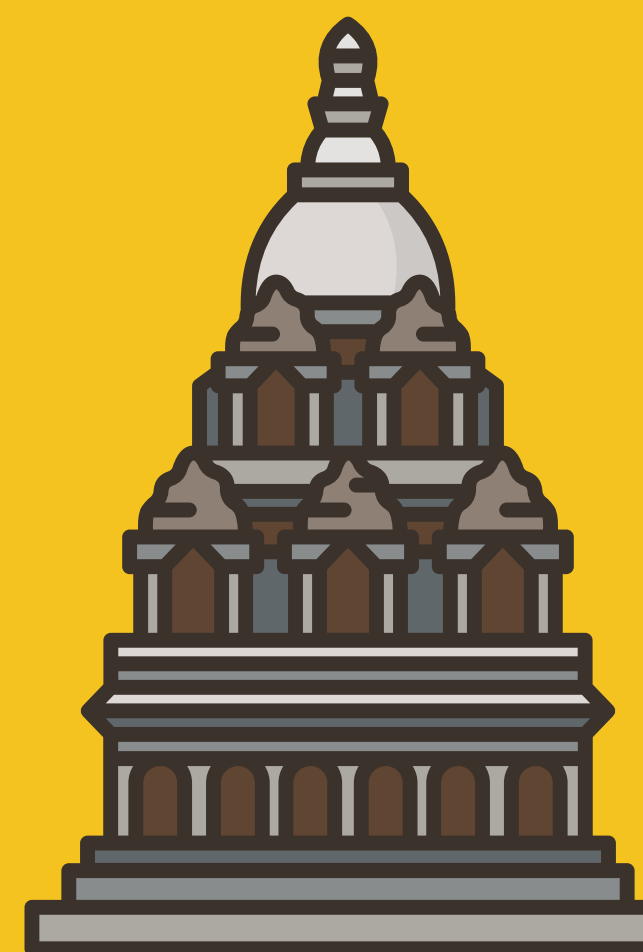
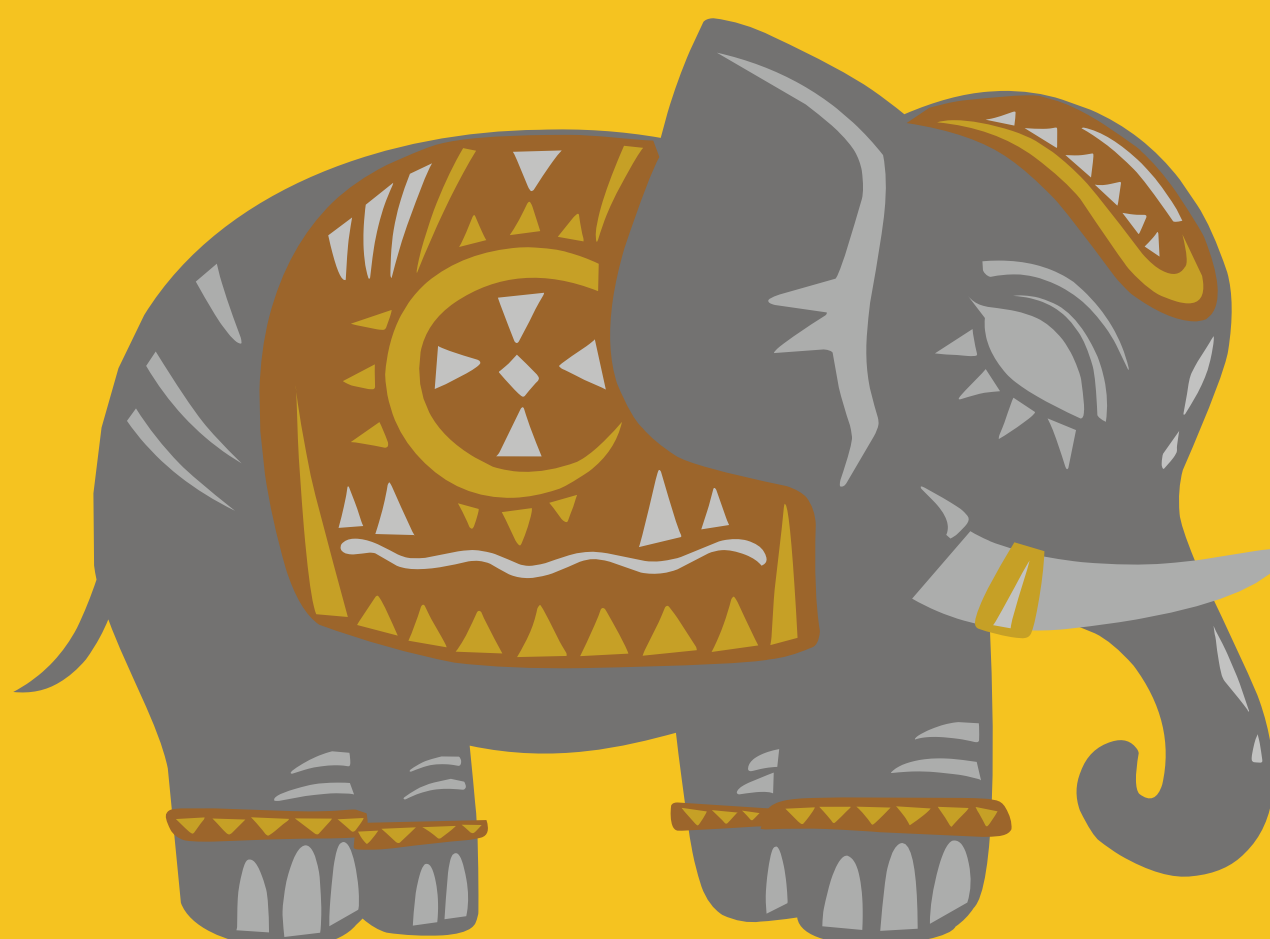

The campaign, being launched with the support of Ministry of Culture, basically involves setting up Heritage Clubs in schools to create awareness of and appreciation for local heritage among children. Activities of the school-based Heritage Clubs include conserving heritage monuments, creating awareness of endemic endangered species and popularizing traditional practices in various fields.

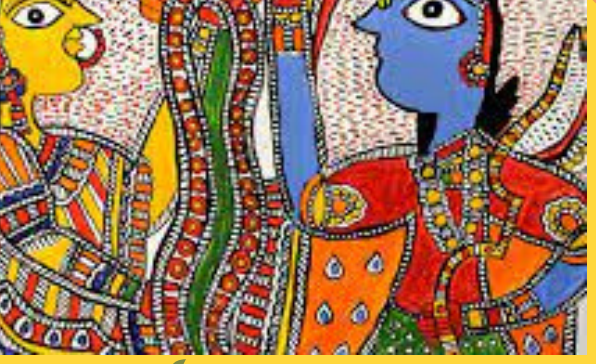

In particular island nations of the Maldives and the Marshall Islands were very vocal of their disapproval of the last minute changes, however they believed that this was better than no deal, in the interests of the other things that it offered. It is now time to sit and ponder over the question, how exactly is India amongst other countries going to reduce the use of coal for power. It is important to remember that 70% of India's electricity alone comes from coal. This makes phasing down coal a harder challenge especially when we recall that coal mining in India employs a lot of rural and tribal population. Clearly there are many stakeholders that stand in the line of fire between climates.

There is also another group of stakeholders on a more international level, the middle east. It is pretty evident that even without a major financial crisis, there has been a lot of struggle in the middle east for well over 50 years. In a world where oil consumption and purchase is at all-time low it could have disastrous consequences for the middle east and other nations that depend highly upon their fossil fuel exports. Only time can tell us how the results of new climate targets that the resolution of COP26 brought. But it is important for the government regardless of the effects to have a standby plan to mitigate any unwanted side effects of the resolution..
